In Co-Founding the Toronto International Film Festival (TIFF) - Henk transformed the Canadian film industry, he changed the types of films they were made in Canada and the types of films Canadians were able to see. In producing ***Outrageous*** (starring Craig Russell), he changed the way Canadians see themselves.

Now in its 35th year, TIFF is the largest publicly attended film festival in the world. Over 500,000 people saw 300 films over 11 days this past September.

It all started with a couple of guys, one hotel, a couple of cinemas and a dream.
